**LOW LIGHT VISION**

Night driving is visually difficult for many people, especially older ones. Reflections from the lights of oncoming cars often confuse drivers and distort their visual perception and judgment.

Some tinted lenses, such as blue blockers, may cut down the glare of artificial lights, but they also reduce the overall transmission of light to the eyes themselves.

Advanced optical technology, however, has now made it possible to produce anti-reflection lenses that not only reduce glare, but also permit more light to enter the eyes. Therefore, the tints - that part of the eyes responsible for seeing in dim illumination - can adapt more rapidly to darkness as do light ends and night begins. The increase in adaptation to light changes reduces the strain of seeing clearly at night.
