end, though the council approved a donation of \$600 for the reconstruction of a skateboarding ramp.

Main Street Program representatives Lynn Garrett and Carol Sparks requested permission to block off Main Street from Locust to Broadway for the Christmas on July celebration, July 21.

"What started as a small idea has grown into a full scale event with every business in Carlisle participating," Garrett said. "It is more than we anticipated."

On Friday, Sparks said there will be free carriage rides and street dancing from 6:10 p.m. and they have received permission from the Nicholas County Fiscal Court to back trucks into space next to the courthouse lawn for a farmer's market on Saturday from 9 a.m. until noon.

The council gave permission to block Main Street, pending state approval, for Friday evening's festivities. The Chamber of Commerce is on record for their full support of the Main Street program, Hester said.

At the same time as the Main Street event, Sherry Howard, representing Nicholas County's four townships, announced a swim and cocktail for Nicholas County teens ages 13-18. Howard said the organization will rent out the swimming pool at Blue Lake State Park.

Council members said the fiscal court had a new roof put on the front of the building and Hester said most of the damage he saw is toward the back of the building.

Yaughe said he received information about a new type of roofing using rubber and felt. Yaughe said he also knows some local roofing contractors.

The council will take no action until both construction reports on the condition of the roof and the cost for repair.

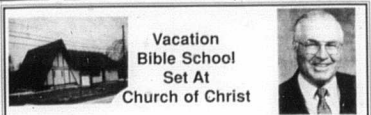

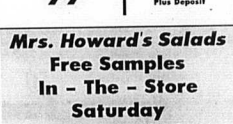
