

Future uncertain; activities abound

Through the future of the lake is uncertain, Buford Clark, manager of Clay Wildlife, said there are a number of other activities the area offers to sportsmen and campers.

With 400 acres of land between Myers Station and Buzzard's Roost, Clay Farm provides a number of unique opportunities for the sportsman and outdoorsman. "We are connected with approximately nine miles of the Linking River and the entire farm is all connected in one boundary," Clark said.

The area is not fished through lease, but is rather paid for the people who use it, Clark said.

The advantage of the Wildlife area is the early hunting season which, Clark said, allow hunters some extra time to hunt.

The only season to open earlier statewide is squirrel season from October first and runs to the end of December and Rabbit and Quail season begins November first and also runs to the end of December.

For the first time, Clark said,

The Wildlife area had its first open Dove season for the first of September.

There was a good turnout for Dove season. People came from at least 19 different counties including two from Ohio," Clark said.

Included is a small lake with good fishing, Clark said, as well as a small boat ramp to the Linking River, open from the lower quit entrance.

The Nicholas County Sportsman's Archery Club has had an archery range installed when they need to have tournaments. It is also open to the public, Clark said.

Hunting seasons run from September to December, but the area is open to the public year round with one exception.

For two days, December 2 and 3, the Wildlife area sponsors a deer quote hunt for serious hunters.

The quote hunt usually has people equipped with high powered rifles and gear which could be dangerous if people are allowed to walk around while this is going on," Clark said.

The number of people allowed to participate in the quote hunt is limited, Clark said.

A deer survey is conducted twice a year to determine the population of the deer in the area and the results of the survey determine how many hunters are allowed in December hunt.

Applications for the hunt can be obtained in the Clay Wildlife office and check station, though filling out the application is no guarantee of participation.

The hunters are chosen randomly and hunters are informed a few weeks prior to the quote hunt if they are to be included.

The Wildlife area also sponsors a youth hunt for kids 10-16 years old. However, all participants must be accompanied by a parent.

I have examined the statement of revenue, expenses, and cash (fund) balances on the basis of the Nicholas County Fire Department for the year ended June 30, 1989. As described in Note 1 to the financial statement, the organization's policy is to prepare the financial statement on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements; consequently, certain revenue and related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statement is not intended to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

In my opinion, the financial statement referred to in the first paragraph presents fairly the revenue, expenses, and cash (fund) balances of the Nicholas County Fire Department for the year ended June 30, 1989, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1, which basis has been applied in a manner consistent with that of the preceding year.
