Two winners in the state competition will be sent to Williamsburg, Virginia for a three day national meeting where students will discuss issues in business, politics and education.

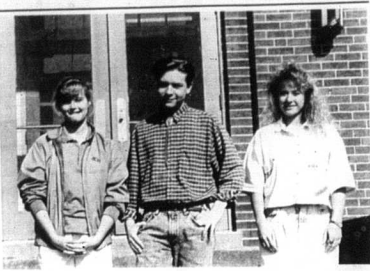
Heath H Hall, who took first place in the school competition, said her subject involved the increase in violent crime in the nation.
