In Bluegrass Conference Nicholas takes tourney opener

CARLISLE - Nicholas County's eighth grade girls basketball team erased a 12-3 Clark Moore lead and exploded for a 19-4 advantage in the second quarter to post an opening round win in the Bluegrass Conference Tournament, Monday night.

Clark Moore took an early 4-0 lead using an aggressive man-to-man, full court defense in the opening minutes of the game. NCCES Coach Barbara Kenney signaled for a timeout and altered her team's defense.

After allowing Clark Moore a 12-3 advantage, keyed by two, three point shots, the junior Jackets only two more baskets the remainder of the half while burning up the nets for a 31-16 lead.

"Our defense really got rolling," Kenney explained. "We changed the inbound play and went long on the passes, and we were able to get a lot of baskets on layups."

Nicholas County maintained its lead of 29-23 at the end of three quarters and posted an 18 point, 48-30 decision to advance in tournament action.

Elizabeth Schanding led all scorers in the game with 22 points while claiming seven steals. Kim Derkins had eight points and 14 rebounds, while dealing out seven assists, as Tawnya Livingood had eight points, 10 rebounds and three assists. Alicia Sibert and Jennifer Willoughby had five points each, while each junior Jacket pulled down seven rebounds.

Nicholas County claimed 45 rebounds in the game, while hitting on 12 of 27 from the charity stripe.

"There's no doubt in my mind the game was won on defense," an elated Kenney said early Tuesday morning. "Once we were able to catch them (Clark Moore) at 12:15, we caught fire and took them out of the game."

"They were unable to run their offense and we were able to control the tempo."

"We changed defenses to a half court zone, and got some easy baskets."

"Clark Moore got in four trouble, but they were very aggressive. They pressed all over the floor and really went after it."

"I was very glad to see this win."

Nicholas County advanced to a Tuesday night game with Paris Southside on the road.

Should the Jackets be able to capture a win, they will return home for a game Thursday night with the winner of the Cankwright (Clark County) and McNabb (Montgomery County), Thursday night.

Should Nicholas continue to advance the finals will be played in Carlisle, Friday night.

According to Kenney the other division has been dominated by Belmont and Woodford County.

Successful tournament play could set up a Nicholas County - Woodford County final, Friday night.

Thus far, Woodford County is the only team to hand Nicholas County a loss this season - in a game played in Carlisle early in the season.

According to Kenney the Jackets were able to take two, very tough road wins at Versailles over Woodford, but a fourth meeting - should that take place - could be especially tough as each team is familiar with the other.
