Generally, the tax on series E and EE bonds is deferred until the bonds are redeemed. But for years tax-savvy parents have purchased bonds in their children's names and elected to pay tax on the interest as it accrued annually.

The idea was that as long as the child's income was below a certain level, no tax was due and the savings bond interest became tax-free. Even when the child's income was taxed, the income usually fell in the low bracket. When the bonds were finally cashed in, no tax was due. On the other hand, folks who deferred the tax until the bonds were redeemed usually had to pay tax on 50 percent or more of the proceeds.

The tax reform cut the amount of tax-free interest income a child can earn to \$500 and created the "kiddie tax," which applies the parent's tax rate to a child's investment income over \$1,000.

The kiddie tax applies only to children under age 14. Those changes pulled the plug on at least some of the tax savings delivered by reporting the interest annually.

To switch from paying tax annually to paying off the bill until the bonds are redeemed you require specific approval. New IRS automatic when you file Form 3115, the "Application for Change in Accounting Method." If you attach one to your child's 1989 return, savings-bond interest accrued during the year does not have to be reported.

Kitchen Korner Apple Molasses Pie Pastry for a 2-crust, 9-inch pie 1/4 C light molasses 1/4 C water 1 tbsps. lemon juice 1/2 tsp. salt 1 C apples, sliced and peeled 1/4 C melted butter 1/4 C flour

Combine molasses, water, lemon juice and salt in large saucepan. Bring to a boil; add apples; lower heat and cook until apples are tender. Remove the slices from syrup. Blend flour and butter; gradually add to hot syrup, stirring constantly. Cook until thick and smooth. Fold apples lightly into syrup. Cool to room temperature. Pour into pastry-lined pan; top with second crust of pastry. Seal and crimp edges. Cut vents into top crust. Bake at 425° for 30 minutes.

Pour into pastry-lined pan; top with second crust of pastry. Seal and crimp edges. Cut vents into top crust. Bake at 425° for 30 minutes.
