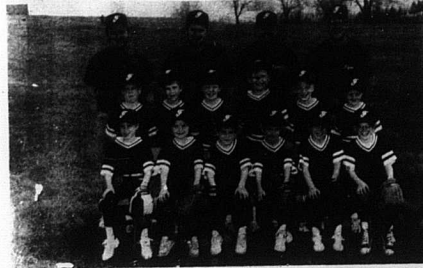

MSU evens record with 35-28 victory

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — Anthony Jardine ran for 130 yards, including a 71-yard touchdown, and Morehead State broke a halftime tie by scoring twice in the third quarter as the Eagles defeated Samford 35-28 Saturday.

The win, moved the Eagles to 5-0 for the second time this season.

After a season opening loss to Marshall University, the Eagles evens their record to 1-1 with a home win over Kentucky State.

Last weekend, Liberty Baptist downed the Eagles 34-14.

Jardine scored on the game's second play, but the score was tied 15-15 at the half. Morehead, 2-2, pulled ahead for good on two touchdowns within 62 seconds in the third period.

Ken Carter scored from the 1 to cap a 58-yard drive, then Doug Bowell intercepted a pass from Samford quarterback Ted Darby and returned it 21 yards to the Bulldogs 20. Chris Swartz capitalized on the turnover with a 21-yard scoring pass to Ty Howard which gave Morehead State a 28-15 lead. Swartz also had a 29-yard scoring pass to Brandon Ford in the second period.

Samford, 1-4, made it close when Darby, who threw for 321 yards, tossed a 12-yard touchdown to Bryan Fisher. But Morehead State sealed the victory late in the fourth period on J.G. Porter's fumble recovery in the end zone.

Darby, who was hampered by two interceptions and six sacks, added an 11-yard scoring pass to Steve Miles to close out the score.

David Primas returned a kick-off 82 yards and Dennis Roy passed 29 yards to J.C. Roper for Samford's first-half touchdowns. Michael O'Neal added a 29-yard field goal.

Morehead begins play in the tough Ohio Valley Conference, this week, with a road game against Murray State, Saturday afternoon.

Junior Jackets girls battle Woodford, Bourbon

Woodford County's seventh grade girls basketball team jumped to a 9-1 lead at the end of one quarter, increased the lead to 19-5 at intermission, led 25-9 at the third stop and continued to roll in posting a 36-13 win.

"By far the best team we have played all season on the seventh and eighth grade level," said NCHS Coach Barbara Kenney.

Melanie Jones had five points and four rebounds to lead Nicholas County. Tara George had four points, Lisa Livingood two, and Jennifer Auxier one.

In eighth grade section... the game was a little closer, however, Woodford County handed

Nicholas County a 29-27 loss. The junior Jackets led at the first three stops, 15-11 at intermission and 21-18 at the end of the third quarter, but Woodford County out scored the Jackets 9-6 in the last six minutes to post the win, and hand Nicholas County its first loss of the season.

Kim Perkins led Nicholas County with nine points, five rebounds and six steals.

Elizabeth Schanding had nine points and nine steals, while Jennifer Wiloughby had three points and five rebounds.

Tanya Livingood and Alicia Sibert had two points each, as Sibert claimed five rebounds.

"Woodford County was ready to play and they wanted to win worse than we did," Kenney said.

"We had poor shot selection and shot a very poor field goal percentage."

Contributing to Nicholas County's downfall was 27 turnovers in the game.

Bourbon tough
Playing without three starters, Nicholas County's seventh grade fell to Bourbon County 30-9.

The young Colonels held the Jackets scoreless in the first half in posting a 14-0 lead.

Bourbon County led 18-3 at the third stop and captured the win with a 12 point out burst in the final six minutes.

Lisa Livingood had four points to top Nicholas County. George had three points and Krystal Hamilton two for the Jackets.

The loss dropped the Nicholas County seventh grade to 3-3 on the County connection on only two of 47 shots.

Nicholas County led 20-9 at the half posting the win. Perkins had seven points and seven rebounds.

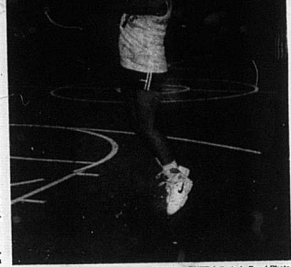
Schanding led all scorers with 16 points, plus five steals and three assists.
