Don Wells Announces for District Judge

It is a privilege to take this opportunity to introduce myself to Nicholas Countians. I recently filed papers to fill a vacancy in Division One of District Court. My opponent on November 7 is Wayne Fitzgerald who dropped out of the Division Two race, so you will definitely have one new district judge in January, and if I am fortunate enough to win your confidence on November 7, you will have two new district judges to start the 1990s!

I am forty-two years old, and grew up on a farm in Pendleton County. I am married, have two grown sons and still live in Pendleton County. My education was at Eastern Kentucky University and Harvard Law School. I have been in private law practice for 17 years and the County Attorney in Pendleton County for three terms. In those 12 years I have been a strong advocate of honest, tough, but fair enforcement of all laws. In my office we have tried to be consistent in applying the same law, the same way, to and for all of our people.

Although I will spare you from a listing of my community involvement and the other "accomplishments" often recited in a political announcement I do want to mention that I am a 17 year member of Falmouth Lions Club, having served two terms as its president, and that I operate a small tobacco and cattle farm in what spare time I have. Although it sometimes seems to me (like for many others) that it costs me to be involved in farming I like to do it, and it keeps things in perspective and me in touch with my roots.

Since this will be a short campaign there is no possible way to personally visit everyone in the four counties involved. I will be in Nicholas County as often and as much as possible in the coming weeks, and have an earnest and sincere desire to meet as many of you as I can. If we fail to meet up during the time before November 7 and you have a thought or question please feel free to call me anytime at the office or home. The numbers are 654-3364 and 654-4541. If I am out campaigning, leave your name and number and I will return your call.

I respectfully suggest to you that it is time for a change on District Court, and believe that I can fill that need. In order to help each other and to work as a team in the fair and effective administration of our laws, we will need to get the message out to your friends and neighbors. If you have an interest in bringing about an "honest-to-goodness" change and bringing common sense back to work in your trial court we will appreciate your help in the campaign. In the meantime, thank you for making me feel welcome in your community. I look forward to spending a whole lot more time with you.

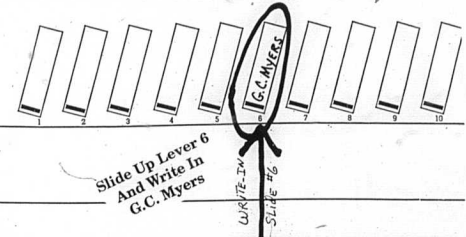
