Jackets allow Eagles early advantage, fall 28-8

RICHMOND - Nicholas County managed only one touchdown halfway into the fourth quarter to keep themselves from a dismal shutout Friday night against the Madison Southern Eagles.

The coin toss went in favor of the Eagles who opted to receive in the second half giving Nicholas County first opportunity with the ball.

But the Bluejackets soon found they had underestimated the Eagle defense as they succeeded in going three yards backwards with the ball culminating in a blown punting opportunity.

The hike on fourth down sailed over punter Brian Ockerman's head into the end zone where the Eagles recovered for their first score.

Kyle Taylor's kick was good for the extra point.

The Bluejackets' next possession did not fare any better as the offense managed only a two yard gain.

The defense was given one break when a pass play, resulting in long yardage, was taken back for a motion penalty against the Eagles.

However, the Eagles were able to pick and choose plays as Jason Stansifer ran for big gains both up the middle and around the ends.

The only stand out play was Brian Hiltner shattering one Madison Southern pick out.

However, the Bluejacket defense was called for encroachment, giving the Eagles a first down and five yard position.

Quarterback Tony Combs, Fullback Kyle Taylor and Stansifer all ran for first down.

Stansifer took the ball up the middle for an 18 yard gain and another Eagle score.

The Eagles faked the extra point kick as Ricky Cross ran the ball around the far end for the two point conversion.

Dale Fawn picked up the next Eagle kick off and nearly lost the ball on a fumble, but the Bluejackets were able to recover.

However, the Bluejackets could not run the ball as Raymond Brown was taken for a two yard loss.

Neither could the Jackets move the ball in the air.

On third down and 12, Madison intercepted Daniel Brown's pass to Jeron Farah and returned it for a big gain.

For a moment it seemed the Bluejackets' defense had put themselves together after Stansifer fumbled and recovered the ball

eight yards behind the line of scrimmage.

Daniel Brown disrupted the next play for no gain and with third down and 14, it appeared as though the Eagles had been stopped.

However, Combs' pass on third down came up complete and on fourth and three, Stansifer easily carried it up the middle for a Madison Southern first down which set up another score and extra point opportunity, putting the Eagles up 22 points before the end of the first quarter.

Though the Bluejackets offense could not manage a first down, despite an exceptional six yard gain by Raymond Brown, Ockerman did manage to get off a punt which, rising with a good

Bluejackets roll, put Madison Southern at their own five yard line.

That punt, combined with a Madison Southern penalty, forced the Eagles to punt the ball away for the first time in the game.

The Bluejackets suddenly began to move the ball on this series beginning with a short pass completion to Farah for four yards, a Raymond Brown five yard run, and another big pass completion to Hiltner for a Nicholas County first down.

But the offense seemed to break down as the Eagles, keying on Jason Bramback, put the running back down for a one yard loss.

The Bluejackets followed up with a pass interception by Combs.
