## Heating systems a major fire source

Check the central heating system early every season, even before turning on the heat, if possible.

Change or clean air filters regularly, every month of the priming heating system if you can.

Wood or coal-burning stoves should be at least a yard away from walls or furniture.

Heating devices should be installed by carefully following all directions, and checked over for cracks or other problems periodically.

AN ORDINANCE Relating to the Annual Levy for 1989 Property Taxes in Nicholas County, Kentucky.

WHEREAS, the 1989 Nicholas County property assessment has been certified as follows:

HOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Nicholas County, Kentucky:

SECTION ONE: There is levied for the year 1989, the amount of all ad valorem taxes on the \$100,000, assessed valuation on all taxable property within the Special Districts or other fund as indicated.

SECTION TWO: This Ordinance shall be published in the Carlsile Mercury by title and amount within thirty (30) days after adoption.

SECTION THREE: This ordinance becomes effective upon passage and publication.
