CARLISLE - Nicholas County's seventh grade girls basketball team ended its season on an up note with a 45-18 win over Bracken County, Monday night.  
The junior Lady Jackets led 10-6 at the end of the first quarter, 19-12 at intermission and exploded in the second half for a 24-5 advantage to post a 45-18 win.  
Jennifer Ausier led the winners with 12 points, as Melanie Jones had nine points and 10 rebounds.  
Other scoring in the win included, Tara George six points, Krystal Hamilton five points and four steals, Lisa Livingston six

points and four steals.  
Tracy Fryman contributed four points, Rebecca Jolly two, and Nicole Sibert one.  
The seventh grade girls ended the season with a 6-7 record.  
The only way a seventh grade team can advance is to win the conference division outright.  
Nicholas County finished third in the seventh grade conference race.  
In eighth grade action... Nicholas County took a 23-2 lead at the end of the first quarter, led 45-8 at intermission and roared to a 91-11 win to end the regular season.
