Jackets absorb tough loss at Mason County, 24-6

MAYSVILLE — Football week against an otherwise solid effort by Nicholas County Bluejackets who lost against the Mason County Royals 24-6 last Friday night. After the Nicholas defense held the Royals to a five yard gain in the first series of downs, defensive end Greg Gilvin broke into the Royal's backfield and blocked the punt.

After a scramble for the ball, Nicholas County recovered deep in Royal's territory. However, after a 3 yard gain before Tuba Mason County's David Mitchell poked off quarterback Jeffrey Parsh's pass for the first turnover of the evening. But the Bluejacket defense, led by linebacker Dale Fawcett, continued to control the middle as they stopped the Royal's running game short of the first down.

The next Mason County possession came out a little stronger and became a steady march up the field, but on a fourth down and 1, though Mason fullback Gary Green made the gain, the Royals were left for hiding and not the Royals to pass. Raymond Brown caught the punt just as he was struck down by Mason. However, Nicholas' field position improved because of futility called the Royals for contact on Brown before he had received the ball. Second quarter action saw Nicholas penalized for the second time for illegal field motion when they were within six yards of another first down.

On the penalty replay, Parsh-faded back for the gain to be brought down in the backfield by Mason tackle Andy Jones. But, after a failed fake punt attempt, Mason gained first possession of the ball when Kris Strode fumbled in the field and Brian Hillander recovered the ball. Nicholas was again called for illegal motion and faced a first down and 15 situation. Nicholas was stopped twice before, on third and 16, Parsh got the pass protection he needed to complete a 15 yard pass to Hillander who took the

ball from there to the 5 yard line before Mitchell stopped him short of the score. Nicholas got three touchdowns to run the ball in, all of which failed to advance the ball. On third down, Nicholas was called for illegal motion and the pass from 11 yards out was intercepted by Brian Tivler. Nicholas returned the favor with a Hillander interception, but on the ensuing series of downs were penalized again for motion.

Brian Ockerman punted the ball out of bounds at the Royal's 23. Toward the end of the half, the Bluejackets' defense pushed Mason to the 18 yard line in a situation when quarterback Brian Mitchell heaved a long slot into the hands of both Raymond Brown and David Mitchell. Both fought for sole possession of the ball when Mitchell pulled it out of Brown's hands and ran the rest of the way for four downs.

Nicholas' Chris Compton received the kickoff and after four plays the buzzer sounded on the first half with the score 6-0 in favor of the Royals. The Royals were almost held on their first possession but for a penalty against Nicholas on a third down and 1 situation. Favore came up with knee injury that kept him out for the rest of the game.

McDowell's pass to Tivler put another touchdown on the board for Mason County. Nicholas, however, came back with a complete pass to Hillander for a 5-yard gain and a 3 yard gain by Raymond Brown which put the Bluejackets within 1 yard of the first down when they were again called for illegal motion. But the gain was nullified by another illegal motion call.

Mason County rallied again for another score by Chris Martine. Nicholas was penalized on the play but Mason declined to accept it. Nicholas County took the kickoff and, on a well-rehearsed series of downs led by the running efforts of Raymond Brown and Hayes Green went around the far side of the field to take the ball for Nicholas' only score and the last score of the evening.

The extra point pass was gained but called back because of illegal motion. On the second attempt Parsh was caught in the end zone.
