Flora finds unexpected occupation after Air Force career

Nicholas County graduate and graduated from Carlisle High School in the early fifties, and she worked for the Air Force. She attended the Naval Academy at Annapolis and graduated in 1958. Nicholas' Senator Ford doesn't agree with plan

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) - An education expert argued over proposals to give parents, teachers and students greater choices in Kentucky's schools, one state lawmaker said he couldn't support the idea because he couldn't go along with a system "that allows one school system to bankrupt another." Freedom of choice is not the answer for the educational problems in Kentucky," said Sen. Ed Ford, D-Cynthiana, during a hearing by the governor's committee of the state Task Force on Education Reform.

Under such a system, students and parents would be allowed to select the schools where children will attend, perhaps if that school is in another district. The lawmaker said he couldn't endorse a scheme "that allows one school system to bankrupt another." David Allen, president of the Kentucky Education Association, said some forms of choice in schools are acceptable, such as magnet schools and special schools for the performing arts. When choices about schools amount to "the private sector for sale of competition, win and lose, it runs counter to equity," he said.

MSU enrollment climbs near 8,000 students

MORBEA, Ky. (AP) - Fall semester enrollment has climbed to 7,917 students at Morehead State University, setting a school record and representing a 39 percent increase since the fall of 1985, school officials said. This semester's enrollment was 7.3 percent above last fall's enrollment of 7,279 students and exceeded the school's previous fall semester high of 7,676 students in 1978. The number of full-time students was 6,123 students this fall, up from 5,589 last fall, said Morehead State President C. Nelson Grede. Nearly every class level had an enrollment gain this fall, he said.
