**FRANKFON, Ky. (AP)** - Larger fines and suspension of all driving privileges for anyone under 21 found to be drinking and driving were among the recommendations of the 1989 General Assembly, said studies.

Drunk driving studies by Jefferson Circuit Judge Barbara Waterfield, who chaired the panel.

The task force made the following recommendations: • Increase the fine for second and subsequent offenses to \$250. The current fine are \$250 for a second offense and \$500 for subsequent offenses. The maximum fines would be increased to \$1,000 for a second offense and \$2,000 for subsequent offenses. Maximum fines and the current \$200 fine for a first offense would not be changed.

• Increase the sentence for conviction for driving under the influence. The fee, which is distributed among law enforcement, treatment and administrative agencies, is up to \$150 for the conviction. The proposal is to increase the fee to \$300 for a first offense, \$400 for a second and \$500 for third and subsequent offenses.

• Driving privileges would be suspended or revoked for anyone under the age of 21 if they are found to have used any alcohol or intoxicant while driving. The suspension would remain in effect until the age of 21.

• Make a fourth conviction for driving under the influence a felony with a penalty of 1-5 years in prison and a maximum fine of \$1,000. If the sentence was probation or suspended in any way, the individual would still have to serve at least 90 days in jail.

A request to allow license of a motor vehicle for a second offense was defeated on a tie vote.
