First quarter surge lifts Paris

PARIS - The final minutes of the Nicholas County - Paris football game Friday night were a comedy of error and penalty that kept the Bluejackets offense to seven points in their loss to the Greyhounds 26-7.

Paris jumped to an early 13-0 lead in the first quarter with quarterback Jerry Barnes scoring from around the end and carrying it up the middle into the end zone.

The Paris offense picked away at the defense, keying on Jason Brumback and holding the offense to only one first down run.

In the second quarter, however, the Bluejackets' defense began to hold their own against the highly touted Greyhound offense, forcing them to punt more often than anticipated.

The offense, however, had its share of penalty troubles early in the game.

Quarterback Daniel Brown had a good passing game with a completion to Brian Hlander for a first down toward the middle of the quarter, but the offense was unable to move the ball farther down the field.

Raymond Brown picked up a short gain, but after a pass, nearly caught, stumbled from Raymond Brown's hands, the offense punted the ball away.

The defense gave nothing away, with Brumback taking Barnes down at the line of scrimmage.

After one run by Washington was stopped short of the first, Justin Abree penetrated at the right moment and took Washington down in the backfield for a loss that was worsened by a 15 yard Paris penalty.

Jeff Hatten and David Courtney kept Brumback to a five yard gain when Raymond Brown received Brown's pass.

However, Brown, knuckled down, fumbled the ball while the referees whistle blew.

Paris recovered the ball but Nicholas retained possession because, referees said, the play was blown dead.

But, Nicholas followed up one fumble with another and this time the turnover counted as linebacker Collier Mathes recovered the ball.

Paris had time enough for two plays. The first, a run up the middle, brought them to the Nicholas 33 yard line, but attempting to pass, Barnes had little time before Travis Sims took him down in the backfield to end the first quarter.

The rain picked up at the beginning of the second half, but it didn't seem to affect Washington as he took the opening kickoff back down the field for a quick Greyhound score to edge them up to 19.

Brumback had problems getting his hands on the ball in the next kickoff, but when he got control, he gained little before David Grigs brought him down deep in Nicholas territory.

Raymond Brown, however, made several rushes everywhere along the line, able to move the ball three to four yards a carry. However, penalties against Nicholas for illegal motion and offside calls kept them shy of a first down.

Chris Grigs returned a short punt and was brought down, but a personal foul penalty against Nicholas gave Paris excellent field position.

However, on this series, penalties caused "more ball movement than play."

Paris had Luke Summers in for quarterback who made a successful end run stopped by Dale Fawns just 2 yards short of the first.

Brumback and Jeron Farah came up on the other end to stop another play in short yardage though Paris made the first down.

LeShan Steward recovered his own fumble caused by Daniel Brown, but it was Darren Gray, carrying it over the middle, breaking two tackles, that ran on into the end zone for a 25-0 game.

The extra point kick was good for 26 points.

However, hopes for a shut out ended when Brumback took the Paris sideline and flat out ran the Greyhound kick off team for Nicholas' only score.

Paris was held for no yardage on two run attempts when Summers broke loose on the end and ran for a first down. However, Summers lost the ball when he was tackled and Nicholas regained control of the ball.

The Bluejacket offense began

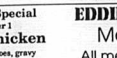
