APRIL 15 DEADLINE All intangible and intangible property must be reported to the Property Valuation Administrator's office in the courthouse by April 15. There are no extensions on property tax. Intangible property is stocks, bonds, cash in out-of-state banks, paid up life insurance left on deposit, etc.

Tangible property is inventories, furniture, fixtures, manufacturing machinery, etc. The Revenue Cabinet has started actively checking records and sending bills for property left off the tax roll. Every business that reported tangible property last year must file again this year or report out-of-business. New businesses must file or Revenue will pick it up as omitted and there will be tax and penalties.
