Hester fears effect of Humana bill

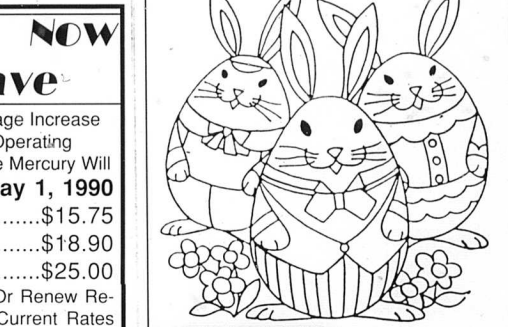

 Though the effects of the Humana Bill have not been felt yet, Rob Hester, chief administrator of the Nicholas County Hospital, said the measure has a very great potential of closing the doors on a number of local county hospitals.
 The controversy over Senate bill 68, the proposed Humana Bill which lacks only Governor Wallace Wilkinson's signature to go into effect, is but one of many charged issues the state government has had to face in the 1990 session.
 Passing the Senate by a mere two votes, 20-18, the bill has all but eliminated hospital bed restrictions in Jefferson County.
 Hester, as part of the Kentucky Hospital Association and an administrator, joined in the association's denunciation of the bill and participated in lobbying efforts to try and block the bill from passage.
 However, Hester said, the political pressures on Jefferson County legislators from Humana were too great to ignore. The hospital, in its demands for lessening of restrictions on its capacity to expand, threatened to pull out some of its insurance HMOs if the bill did not pass.
 The threat, if carried out, Hester said, would have meant the loss of nearly 3,000 jobs.
 However, in the beginning of work on the bill, Humana said they needed to be free to establish The Centre of Excellence, Hester said.
 "The Centre was supposed to be some kind of Mayo Clinic of the South," he said.
 However, he said, plans for the Centre were pulled after the bill passed in the Senate last Friday. Humana announced it would concentrate on merely expanding its existing facilities.
 Basically, Hester said, passage of the bill has given Louisville Hospitals unlimited opportunities to expand services and their patients can easily be provided they have the capital access to afford offering new services.
