Homel Leaford to appear in concert, April 29, 2 p.m., at NCS

CARLISLE - Homel Leaford, one of the finest makers of traditional Appalachian musical instruments, will appear in concert April 29, 2 p.m. at the Nicholas County Elementary School.

The concert is sponsored by the Fine Arts Department of the Carlisle Community Women's Club and is recommended for all ages from kindergarten to senior citizens.

Leaford will bring several of his homemade instruments and demonstrate their sound and style of music.

The youngest of four children, Leaford was born September 26, 1929 in the rural Tennessee mountain country then known as Iyon.

He spent his early youth, until he left home at age 18, on his father's farm near what is now called Alpine, Tennessee.

Although there were no traditional musical instrument makers in either Homel's family or in the immediate neighborhood, there were several self-taught musicians.

Leaford recalls, "I always loved music and loved to play guitar, fiddle, and mandolin. I only began to play when I got my first pocketknife for Christmas at age 13. I tried to make a musical instrument. I guess that's when it all really began. To this day I am lost without my pocketknife."

With his pocketknife as his only tool, 12-year-old Leaford gathered whatever scraps of wood and other likely objects he could find, birch bark, lard cans, dynamic bases, and pine from a barn and, using the strands of screen wire for strings, he tried again and again to make either a banjo or a guitar.

When Leaford was about 16, that ambition was finally realized.

After spending a year trying to make a fiddle stay together with mastic and glue that always fell apart in humid weather, he tried again with the results that "everyone loved music, and in such an atmosphere his own musical talents developed."

Leaford graduated from Eastern KY. State Teachers College in Richmond in 1954 with a degree in industrial arts.

After graduation he moved to Louisville and taught in the public school system. In 1955 he began teaching full-time in the Clark County School System in Winchester, making dollmakers and other instruments in his spare time. In 1963 he resigned in order to devote all of his time to dulcimer making.

Leaford has been listed in "Who's Who in the South," and in the "Dictionary of the International Biography." He has conducted dulcimer making workshops at several folk schools and colleges including John C. Campbell Folk School, Berea College, and Eastern Kentucky University.

He has taught folk music at the National Wildlife Conservation Summit Conference, Black Mountain, N.C., and has participated in a symposium held at E.K.U. and at the University of New York, Buffalo, N.Y. on folk music.
