### Adrian Arnold's priorities for Kentucky

**For Economic Development**

Agriculture will play a vital role in economic development in our state. Agriculture is a \$3.5 billion industry in our state. We need to expand supplemental crops and processing of the crops.

Tobacco is the main crop for this area, and I feel it will be the main crop for some time. However, as tobacco is being attacked from several fronts we need to be planning for alternative methods for farmers.

Kentucky needs to continue its assistance to existing businesses as well as helping to attract new industry.

Eighty percent of all new jobs will be small businesses. Kentucky needs to continue and expand its assistance and support of small business.

During the 1990 session, Kentucky expanded and improved vocational education. A better trained work force will improve the economic climate of Kentucky.

**My Commitment To Agriculture**

1984 - Introduced and Passed HB 34 - Creating inter-agency committee to curtail state government from needlessly developing farm land.

1984 - Introduced and Passed HB 35 - Creating Agriculture Districts to help preserve farm land.

1984 - Voted for HB 51 - Law creating Agriculture Finance Corporation.

1976 - Co-sponsored bill that exempted farm machinery parts from Kentucky Sales Tax.

1990 - HB 557 - Introduced and passed legislation creating an agriculture loan program for small farmers. Hopefully this program with cooperation of local lending institutions will help keep small farmers on the farm.
