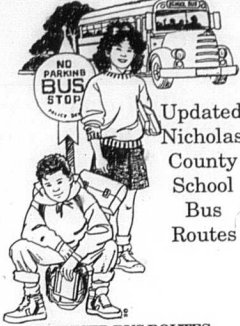

Station operators also said further increases in pump prices were inevitable. Bill Coffey, an employee of Rex and Paul's Shell, said he had only raised their prices by seven cents a gallon at this time.

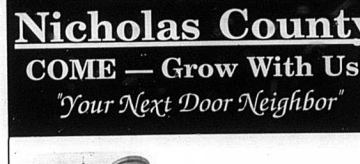
