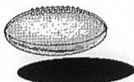

 The Kentucky Wildcats may go places they've never been on the practice field beginning today. First year coach Bill Curry has designs of turning a mediocre football program into one that will contend for championships in a few seasons. And that process begins with blood and guts. "You have to put the experience stress back," Curry said Thursday during media day. "People normally stop when they experience pain. You make him get through it and pain barrier. Then he's really happy. Really happy."  
 But it's not easy for the players. "Practice starts out the first day and so it again and the next and the next until he doesn't want to go anymore," Curry said. "And then it begins to dawn (on the player), I can do this."  
 Senior offensive linemen Steve Smith said he had a good grasp on it. Don Ochia has who back. There's some people like Vince Lombardi, who had a good grasp on it. Don Ochia has a handle. Vince Lombardi knew I didn't know any champions who don't understand it.  
 Curry, who led Alabama to a share of the championship Conference title last year, said Kentucky has the reputation of a "hardwood, tough, disciplined football team" across the country. But it was a team that lasted a winning streak in the decade of the 1980s. Kentucky won only three winning seasons.  
 "What we do compared against them, we felt we had an advantage in that our players felt they were going to win and maybe the Kentucky players didn't but they ought to win," Curry said. "There ought to be a reflection on the coaching staff. I think it's a reflection on the whole medical toward Kentucky football for a long, long time."  
 The Wildcats will have three-a-day workouts through next Monday. They will then don pads and begin two-a-days until classes begin Aug. 21.

 Georgetown, Ky. (AP) — Reputation earned Georgetown College a few points in the Mid-South Football Conference preseason poll. Although Georgetown graduated 13 starters from last year's conference championship team, the regular season made Coach Peter Onley's squad the team to succeed again in 1990 during media day activities Saturday.  
 The Tigers have won two conference titles and played in two NCAA Division II playoff games the past three seasons. They compiled a 22-6-1 mark during that time.  
 Georgetown received four first place votes, while second place choice Cumberland (Ky.), Georgetown received four first place votes. Union was voted fourth and Tennessee No. 3 Evansville and No. 5 Campbellsville each had one.  
 Newcomer Lenoir-Rhyland and Cumberland, both located in Tennessee, are not eligible for the conference title until 1991.
