Washington to celebrate

The village of Washington will celebrate its frontier heritage at the 14th annual Simon Kenton Festival to be held September 15-16.

The 1700's era town, at one time the county seat of Mason County and one of the largest cities in Kentucky, hosts the Simon Kenton Festival each year during the third weekend in September. The festival, named in honor of the famous wilderness explorer and pioneer, Simon Kenton, who spent 14 years of his life in Washington.

The festival will be held from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Saturday and from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday, and will feature a parade, frontier craft demonstrations and much more.

In addition to the 5 museums which are an integral part of Washington's tourist attractions, the Pillsbury House (circa 1815) will be open for tours from 3 to 4 p.m. both days. Food booths, Lion's Club Bingo, antique and craft exhibits from throughout the festival will line the streets.

Harry Tucker, master of ceremonies for the two-day event, will open the festivities at noon on Saturday. Entertainment is scheduled throughout the afternoon and evening and a street dance featuring the Embers Band will begin at 7 o'clock. On Sunday the entertainment begins at noon with the parade scheduled to begin at 3 p.m.

A large loom, used during the Civil War era to weave bedding will be exhibited by Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Pries of Carlisle, Ky., and other demonstrations will include chair caning, basket weaving, textiles, woodcrafts and more.

Exhibitors who wish to be included in the festival should contact organizers at 606-759-7423 between 9 a.m. and 11:30 p.m. Demonstrations are also invited. To participate in the parade call 606-759-5252 or 759-7074.

The entire downtown district of the village is listed on the National register of Historic Places. Most of the houses were built from 1785 to 1815. Washington lies nestled 4 miles from the banks of the Ohio River on US 68 south of Maysville. Put this historic treasure on your list of places to visit. You'll be glad you did.
