## Tougher regulations in effect

New tougher state regulations controlling incineration of municipal solid waste went into effect this month. Prior state regulations governing incineration of waste were inadequate of a series of changes mandated by Gov. Wallace Wilkinson in an executive order issued in January. The governor's order imposed a moratorium on issuance of state permits for the construction or operation of any new or expanded waste incinerator under then-current regulations and instructed the Department for Environmental Protection to develop new regulations.

The new regulations governing municipal solid waste incinerators went into effect Nov. 15 upon the adjournment of the legislature's Interim Joint Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources. The committee approved the regulations, completing the approval process.

Under previous regulations, municipal solid waste incinerators with a burn load greater than 500 pounds per hour were required to adhere to various limits on particulate matter emissions depending on the size and age of the unit. The new regulations tighten the particulate emission limits and establish limits for other pollutants including organic compounds (cancer-causing agents such as dioxin and furans), acid gases (sulfur dioxide and hydrogen chloride), acids of inorganic carbon and monoxide.

The new regulations also require incinerators to be designed and operated according to prescribed standards, and require a recycling rate of no less than 40 percent of material that otherwise would have been burned. Some items such as yard waste and batteries will be prohibited from incineration.

These new rules parallel proposed federal regulations in many respects. They are intended to mesh with solid waste management programs within the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Cabinet. "As we demand more responsible waste management and demand better pollution control at waste disposal facilities, we expect a shift to
