MAYSVILLE — The Nicholas County Lady Jackets pulled off another easy victory Thursday, defeating Mason County 61-48.

The victory put the Lady Jackets record at 4-0.

Nicholas County won with good foul shooting and defense.

The Lady Jackets shot 66 percent from the line.

Barbara Kenney, Nicholas County coach, said her team played aggressive defense and executed their game well overall.
