



### Watkins attends meeting for clerks in Owensboro

Nicholas Circuit Clerk Sully Watkins attended the 1990 Circuit Clerks' Fall Conference at Owensboro's Executive Inn Hotel, November 7-9.

Steve Coffey, Director of Driver Licensing, State Transportation Cabinet, and support staff addressed the Driver Licensing On Line System and Commercial Driver Licensing Procedures. The new computer system will be installed and in effect by July 1, 1991.

The system will eliminate the time for changes made to licenses, license status, and provide better and faster service to the public.

Commercial driver license testing will begin in January 1991. Notification will be sent to all operator/hauler/owner beginning in December 1990.

Every year driving a commercial motor vehicle weighing 26,000 lbs., carrying hazardous materials or 15 passengers or more will be required to have a commercial driver license by April 1, 1992.

Mike Ward, State Representative, Louisville, and sponsor of House Bill 41, addressed the intent of the high school drop out bill.

Students must now present to the clerk their birth certificate, signed parental consent, school enrollment verification form and have parent or legal guardian present to give consent when the student applies for a driver permit.

Driver licenses may now be revoked if a 16 or 17 year old drops out of school, fails four subjects or has nine or more unexcused absences.

FRANKFORT — The AA Highway threading through four lanes in Campbell County and around the northwestern counties, was formally opened Tuesday.

Wilkinson and state Transportation Secretary Milo D. Bryant led a caravan from Vansburg to an Interstate 275 interchange in Campbell County, with a stop in Mayfield.

The \$110 million highway, so named because it originally was to link Ashland with Alexandria, began during the administration of then-Gov. John Y. Brown Jr., who left office in 1983.

Two sports of the highway, connecting Vansburg with Grayson and Greenup Dan Bridge, are being built.

Brown and his successor, Martha Layne Collins, were invited to take part in Tuesday's ceremony.
