Jackets down Pendleton County, 70-59

FALMOUTH — The Nicholas County Bluejackets improved to 6-1 with a win with a 70-59 victory over Pendleton County Tuesday night.

Led by Brian Hillander's 22 points and Daniel Brown's 26, the Bluejackets took control of the lights contest in the fourth quarter.

The Bluejackets executed their offense to near perfection in the final period. The Nicholas County squad shot eight for eight in the period and made timely free throws to turn a one-point game into a double digit win. Nicholas County coach Ed Oakley was pleased with his team's performance.

"I told the team at halftime we had to get back to things we had been doing. In the first half we forced too much. Oakley said he wanted to find five starters and one who would play together and run the offense."

"We finally executed pretty well in the fourth quarter. Oakley said that when we have open shots we're going to make them. Nicholas County's offensive execution enabled the smaller Bluejackets to overcome a tall, robust Pendleton County squad. Starting a frontline of 6-5, 6-5 and 6-3 the Wildcats worked the ball inside and rebounded well. Several Wildcat buckets came on second halves.

"The game got off to a rocky start for Nicholas County as Bluejackets controlled the ball, but Brian Hillander, who led the effort, was blocked by the Wildcats Bill Yelton, a 6-7 center.

"The Wildcats scored on their first trip down court when we called. Nicholas County answered with a Travis Sims basket and the two teams settled into a basket trading first.

"The first half was marked by defense. Pendleton County played a hard man to man all night. Nicholas County went to their 2-3 zone press harassed the Wildcats guards."

"I wanted to use pressure tonight because I don't think they had any guards," Oakley said, "but they broke the press and we didn't play at very well all times."

Nicholas County, supported by Brian Hillander's steady play, spurred to 27-21 lead midway through the second quarter. Pendleton County scored cut the lead and regrouped.

AMENDED RATE RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BATH AND NICHOLAS COUNTY DISTRICT WATERWORKS AUTHORITY AMENDING THE EXISTING WATER RATE SCHEDULE

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners (the "Commission") of the Bath and Nicholas County District Waterworks Authority (the "Authority") has reviewed the existing water rates and has determined that certain amendments, additions and improvements to the existing water rates are necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Bath and Nicholas County District Waterworks Authority, after giving due notice and opportunity for public hearing, has determined that the proposed amendments, additions and improvements to the existing water rates are in the best interests of the public and should be adopted; and

Section 4. Minimum Monthly Charge in Addition to Minimum Monthly Rate. That the minimum monthly charge specified above shall apply to the respective minimum quantities of water sold each month to customers of all six site connections.

Section 5. Connections. That the waterworks connection charge shall continue to be \$350.00 for 2 inch or larger. The connection charge for 1 1/2 inch shall be \$250.00. The connection charge for 1 inch shall be \$175.00. The connection charge for 3/4 inch shall be \$100.00. The connection charge for 1/2 inch shall be \$75.00.

Section 6. Multiple Meters on One Meter. That where two or more meters are installed on the same premises for separate residences, apartment houses, mobile home parks, trailers parks or other multiple uses, the water rates shall be based on the largest meter and charge to each meter or occupant shall be computed by the number of meters in the premises.
