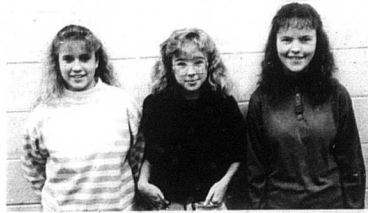

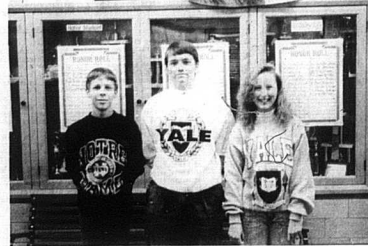

Nicholas native C.V. Snapp passes at the age of 101

By Tim Whitaker. Letcher County News Press. Carlos Victor "C.V." Snapp, a Nicholas educator and John-son County native, died February 1, 1990, at the age of 101. He was born in 1888 in Carlisle, Snapp began teaching in 1910, serving as a school leader for 50 years.

He moved to Letcher County to serve as the superintendent of the school system in 1929. He served as the Jenkins School Superintendent until 1961, when he left to become the superintendent of Pike County. He later worked for the Pike County Board of Education until his retirement. He then returned to Jenkins, taking a seat on the board of education in 1969-86. He spent nearly 75 years of his working in education. He was a charter member of the University of Kentucky Phi Delta Kappa and the Jenkins Kiwanis Club. Snapp was honored many times during his life by various organizations, government officials and civic organizations, including President George Bush.

Listening to former colleagues and friends in Jenkins, one learns quickly that Snapp had a lasting impression on not only the town's school system, but the community as well. Joe Walters, a Jenkins Board of Education member and vice chairman of the Kentucky School Facilities and Construction Commission, said Snapp was most helpful in getting him organized as a school board member 11 years ago. "One thing I will always remember about Mr. Snapp is that he always based his board decisions on how they would affect the children," Walters said.

"I guess what strikes me the most about him is his persistence in striving for what he believed in," Walters continued. "Everyone knew that music was his second love, and it was his persistence in stressing music's importance that ultimately led to adding music back into our curriculum at Jenkins."

Jenkins, Letcher County and the state has lost their most experienced educator and the most devoted one as well," Walters said. "He devoted his entire life to educating our children."

Members of the Jenkins Kiwanis Club, where Snapp was a founding member in 1939, are quick to point to his contributions to that organization also.
