## Blazers burn trail to All-A title

LEXINGTON — It took one

quarter before University Heights mastered Owsley County, walking away with a 75-59 win in the Kentucky All "A" Classic state tournament Feb. 10.

The two teams brought the tournament's best records into the final game (University Heights 22-4 and Owsley County 21-4), and both played three players on the all-tournament team.

Owsley's Jeff Moore, a 6-5 senior, was the tournament MVP. Moore had a game-high 29 points in the Owls' loss to University Heights.

University Heights had four players in double-figures for the game, with guard Marty Cline leading the way.

Sergio Luyk, a Spanish exchange student, pulled down 14 rebounds and scored 13 points for the victorious Blazers.

Moore burned up the nets in the first quarter, scoring 13 of Owsley's 18 points.

Owsley was off to a 9-2 start when Harold Creech hit a field goal.

After a Moore bucket put the Owls up 16-9, University Heights cut Owsley's lead to 16-15 at the 1:53 mark.

A layin by Moore at the buzzer rounded out first quarter scoring with the Owls lead at 18-15.

The Blazers took charge in the second quarter and did not relinquish control, shutting down Moore with triple teams on the inside and Creech's 3-point shot on the outside.

Blazer Coach Roy Woolam said his team adjusted it's defense to prevent a repeat of Owsley's first quarter performance.

"We went to a 1-3-1 (in the second) (in the first quarter) we went to a man-to-man and we couldn't do much. Moore has a great pair of hands," Woolam said.

In the second quarter, Derrick Quarles opened scoring with a 3-pointer that tied the score at 18-18.

After that, the Blazers broke away and did not let Owsley get close.

All-tournament selection James White connected on a hook shot to make it 22-20, University Heights.

Craig Marshall, who also landed a spot on the all-tournament squad, hit two free throws at the 3:12 mark to make it 23-23, but the Owls did not come closer.

The Blazers raced to a 29-21 advantage before Creech managed a field goal to make it 29-23.

University Heights led 31-23 at the half.

In the third period, Moore opened it with a bucket to make it 31-25.

The Blazers then scored 12 straight points and held a 41-25 advantage on a field goal by White.

Luyk stretched it to 47-30 on a field goal.

Jason Wilson cut University Heights lead to 51-41 on a 3-pointer to end the quarter.

Owsley could not come closer in the fourth period.

The Blazers led by 15 points when Luyk hit a shot that made it 59-44.

A field goal by Moore at the 2:40 mark closed the teams to 62-62, but University Heights outscored Owsley 13-7 in the remaining stretch.

"I was afraid I might die without ever winning one (a state championship)," said Woolam, a 30-year coaching veteran.

Owsley shot a disappointing 19 of 53 from the field and three of 16 from 3-point range. The Owls hit 18 of 23 from the line.

University Heights connected on 25 of 52 from the field, six of 11 3-point shots and 19 of 26 from the stripe.
