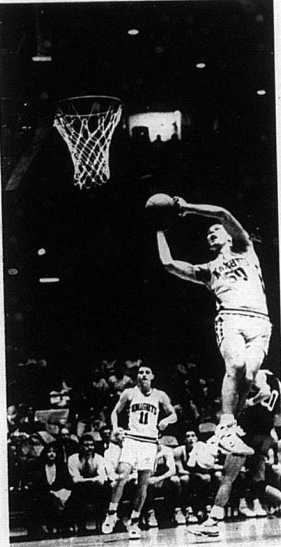

Mason takes 76-66 win over Jackets

 MASONVILLE — The Nicholas Bluejackets lost to Mason County 76-66 Feb. 8.

Brian Hillender led the Jackets with 20 points, but his team could not hold together for a fourth quarter rally that ran out of gas.

The Royals were led by Ryan Tolliver with 24 points.

The Bluejackets raced to a 9-5 lead, following a David Sparks tip in, but Mason came back and tied at 9-9 on a field goal by Tolliver at 3:37.

Mason went up 11-9 and a D.J. Jackson goal made it 13-9.

Sparks answered with a field goal for Nicholas, and Eric Goodwin hit two free throws to round out first quarter scoring, giving Mason a 15-11 lead.

The Royals stretched their lead in the second quarter and never looked back, weathering several Nicholas County surges.

Mason raced to a 28-11 lead, holding Nicholas County scoreless for nearly 3 1/2 minutes in the second.

Daniel Brown finally broke the jinx at the 4:40 mark on a field goal that made it 28-13.

Nicholas recouped near the end of the half, cutting the gap to 37-29 on a rebound shot at the buzzer.

The Jackets cut the lead to five at 43-38 on a Hillender field goal at the 4:30 mark. "It" continued to spark the third quarter drive by Nicholas. His alley oop play at the 1:15 minute mark made the score 49-42 as the Jackets stayed close.

The Royals managed to go up 52-42 after three.

Nicholas County could not repeat its third quarter rally in the fourth and failed to hold together a coherent offense.

Tolliver canned two straight field goals to stretch Mason's lead to 61-42, before Nicholas got its first score of the fourth.

The Jackets surged again midway through the fourth. Brown nailed a 3-pointer at 4:30 to make it 63-51.

A bucket by Travis Sims cut the Mason lead to 69-61.

Mason added four more before Hillender sank a goal with 12 seconds left to make it 75-63, and Hillender hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer to round out scoring.

Brown had 18 for Nicholas, followed by Jarrod Wills and David Sparks with eight each, Sims with six, Simons with four, and Tibbs with two.

Goodwin was in double figures for Mason with 13. Eight players netted points for the Royals.
