Jackets take homecoming win over Owen

Dat. J Brown brought in 10 3-point shots in Friday's Nicholas County Bluejackets homecoming win over Owen County, 90-76.
Brian Hillander opened the game with a two point layup at 7:36. But soon after Owen tied the game. Brown went down for his first 3-point shot in the game.
However, Owen did not remain behind long as Keith Sagesser, Roy Stafford, and Bryan Bond sent the ball flying down court that left Hillander in the clear for a shot to trail Nicholas by one, 7-6.
Owen took the lead on their next possession as Bond rebounded his own shot for a goal with 4:00 left in the quarter.
Brown and Sagesser traded shots, but at 3:20 Brad Shelton hit to advance the Rebels 3 points ahead. Brown came back down, stopped and shot from the top of the key to tie the score at 12 each.
Shelton put Owen back up by two, but Brown went back and regained a jackets lead with his third consecutive 3-pointer, 15-14, Nicholas.
Shelton brought Owen back to the lead one more time, but Sparks sent back down for the Jackets.
By the end of the first quarter, the score was 22-19, Jackets.
Owen opened with a shot to cut the jackets lead back to one and threatened to tie the lead on a steal before Brown brought in number five at 6:23.
Hillander brought in two as Brown baited the ball to him to set up an easy layup.
Though at one point Owen trailed by seven, Jim Kemper's 3-pointer suddenly made it a two point ball game as Owen trailed, 30-25. Brad Shelton almost tied

the score, but a foul discounted his layup and the Rebels remained 40 behind.
Three quick shots, including another 3-pointer from Brown, reestablished Nicholas' 10 point lead.
However, by halftime, Owen scored to trail by a small six point margin, 29-23.
Brown opened the second half with two 3-point shots, followed by Sparks and Travis Sims.
However, at 5:01, a long pass from Brown came in too hard for Hillander to catch. Hillander hit the ball toward Sparks to salvage the score, 54-25.
After Brown's 3-pointer at 4:41, Bryan Bond broke Owen's 35 score stand with a 3-point shot.
However Hillander, off a foul from Kemper, turned a layup into a 3-point play for the Jackets.
By the end of the third, Hillander came down the court and faked a shot, sliding the ball off to Jamie Simons.
Simons, not ready, almost loses the ball, but Hillander still hit the shot for 61-44.
An underhanded bounce pass from Wills to Sparks put the Jackets up by 20 at 6:45.
However, by 4:32, Sims chucked up his fifth foul and left the game.
Brad Shelton brought in a 3-point play as Wills fouled Shelton on his drive toward the basket.
Bond hit for 3 points on the left side of the line for the score, 77-68.
At 31 seconds, Shelton hit the last 3-point basket of the evening and with one more score, the buzzer sounded, 90-76, Jackets.
Head Coach Lee Cruse said he is very pleased with the win. The boys shot the ball well, he said. We were hitting from any place on the court," Cruse said.
However, he felt the team needs work defensively, considering

Owen outscored Nicholas in the fourth.
Top scorer for Nicholas was Daniel Brown with 38 points, followed by Hillander with 21 and Sparks with 14.
