Tough Mason County hands Nicholas loss

CARLISLE — The tough passing game of Mason County proved too much for Nicholas County as the Royals rolled to a 91-71 victory Jan. 18.

The game saw three Nicholas players foul out, including the Jackets' offensive duo of Brian Hilsander and Daniel Brown. Travis Sims also fouled out in the closing seconds of the game. Brown stole the ball and made a layup for the first score of the game, but Mason answered by mounting an 8-4 after Jason Goodwin canned a field goal. Nicholas cut the lead to 8-7 when David Sparks rebounded and scored off a missed free throw.

Mason posted a 14-7 lead before Hilsander broke the ice with a field goal at the 3-minute mark of the first period.

Sims netted two points to cut the Royals' lead to 14-11.

Mason County's full court pressure defense gave Nicholas problems in the early going, and the quarter closed with the Royals holding a 21-13 lead.

Mason ran up a 16-point advantage at 36-20 on a goal by Ryan Tolliver and went to the lockers with a 42-27 lead.

Nicholas County, suffering from poor outside shooting in the first half, changed to an inside game in the third period to trim Mason's lead.

Brown scored two straight buckets to open the third period, and a bucket by Sparks at the 6:20 mark cut the lead to 44-24.

Brown finally got his outside shooting going in the third period, hitting a 3-pointer with six minutes left to make the score 44-37.

Nicholas was never able to close the gap beyond that point in the second half, though.

The third period ended with Mason holding a 63-54 lead.

A field goal by Goodwin gave Mason a 79-65 advantage in the fourth.

Hilsander fouled out at the 4:13 mark in the fourth, with his team trailing 81-66.

Brown fouled out about three minutes later at the 1:28 mark.

Mason got its biggest lead in the closing minutes at 90-60, as the visiting Royals came away with the win.

Brown netted 37 points for Nicholas County. Sparks turned in a 14-point performance, and Hilsander was in double figures with 11.

Jamie Simons scored five points, and Sims and Shaé Tibbs had two each.

Mason was led by Jason Goodwin with 21 points. Tolliver scored 18, Shane Morgan scored 13, David Mitchell and D.J. Jackson added 12 each.

Lady Colonels erase lead, win 55-40

Though mounting an early 4-point lead, the Nicholas County Lady Jackets fell to the Bourbon County Lady Colonels, 55-40, Jan. 15.

Nearly two and a half minutes elapsed in the first quarter before Christy Hatton opened scoring in the game with a jumper.

Kim Denkins brought in another two before Bourbon's Becky Gillispie put points on the board.

Reed checked up her third foul with only 1:17 to go in the first quarter.

Sylvia Oliver brought Bourbon to the lead for the first time in the quarter to give Bourbon a 4-point advantage to start the second quarter.

Nikki Smoot tied the score once before Oliver and Gillispie scored in the last few seconds of the quarter to give Bourbon a 4-point advantage to start the second quarter.

By the 5-minute mark, the Lady Colonels had a 5-point lead, 20-15.

Denkins scored Nicholas last points in the half at 1:40.

Bourbon rallied in the final seconds and moved to a 9-point lead, 30-21, at the end of the half.

Hatton and Smoot put together a quiet Nicholas rally, which cut Bourbon's lead to 30-27.

Denkins logged foul four as Bourbon went on a scoring rally to put the Lady Colonels 10 points ahead in the early part of the fourth quarter, 43-33.

Heather McCarty bagged Bourbon's last shot to end the game, 55-40.

Hatton was Nicholas County's lead scorer with 12 points in the game, followed by Denkins with 10 and Smoot with 9.
