**Kitchen Korner**

Cinnamon Apple  
Sliced Potatoes

1/4 C sugar  
1 1/2 C finely chopped potatoes  
1/2 tsp. cornstarch  
1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon  
1/2 C orange juice  
1 tsp. grated orange peel

Wash sweet potatoes; prick with fork. Place on paper towels and cook on high (100 percent power) in the microwave 10 to 12 minutes, or until tender, turning halfway through cooking. Set aside.

Combine remaining ingredients. Cover and cook on high for 2 minutes. Stir mixture, then cook uncovered on high 1 to 2 to 2 minutes or until the sauce is thickened. Stir sweet potatoes and spoon sauce over each one. Makes 4 servings.

Note: Sauce can be made ahead and reheated at serving time.
