REPORT IMPROVEMENTS TO PROPERTY

Property owners who have made improvements to their property during the past year need to report those changes to the PVA office as soon as possible.

An example of improvements to be reported include room additions, adding a bath, complete kitchen remodeling, adding central air, fireplace, adding siding or brick, building a carport, garage (attached or unattached), swimming pools, blacktopping or concreting a driveway, or anything added to existing property that would add to the Market Value.

This pertains to all property: Residential, Farm, Trailers and Commercial.

Routine maintenance such as repainting a roof, painting and wall papering, replacing old carpet, etc. does not need to be reported.

If your property has been harmed or damaged during the past year, this should be reported so changes can be made to your property value.

Please stop by the PVA office on the second floor of the courthouse as soon as possible. If you cannot come in, call 289-5100 and report the changes over the phone.
