Nicholas County Fire Chief Mark Hughes and Carlisle firefighter Tommy Crawford have gone together to see that all volunteers receive their annual training hours.

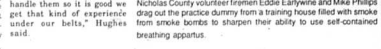
with at least 60 percent certified, meaning basically that they have passed a minimum of 150 training hours.

The state fire Marshall is really pushing for this program to go through. We know about hazardous chemicals but not a one of us knows how to handle them so it is good we get that kind of experience under our belts," Hughes said.
