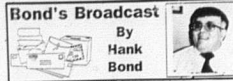

The valves would cut off water flow in the digester basin and drop excessive flow into two dry wells.

Though Kelly admitted the plan would not be the entire answer to rain problems, the sewer plant could see, it would give the plant better ability to manage with another way of dealing with rain water can be devised, he said.
