Nicholas pulls away in second half to win

CARLISLE, Feb. 23 — The Nicholas County Bluejackets, leading Deming by only 10 at half time, went on a roll in the second half to defeat the Black Devils 88-63 in the last regular-season game.

The Devils led in the first quarter when Jamie Morgan pulled up and fired in three points for a 5-4 score two minutes into the game.

But with a 3-point shot from Brian Hilander, the Bluejackets took a 9-5 lead, with about four minutes elapsed.

Wayne French maintained the four point trail with a jumper at 3:26, for an 11-7 score, but the Jackets scored six straight points for a 17-7 lead late in the first quarter.

But before the clock ran out, Morgan again fired in a 3-pointer to cut the Jackets' lead. However, Hilander brought in a last-second 3-pointer to end the first period with Nicholas County leading 20-10.

With another Morgan 3-pointer and a layup from Aaron Massey, the Jackets lead was cut to six.

A pair of 3-pointers from Daniel Brown at 4:55 made the score 30-18.

Lindsey Leet brought the Devils' trail back to 10, but they would not get closer to the Jackets in the second half.

At the end of two periods, Nicholas led Deming 24-24, Jackets.

The Devils matched the Jackets shot for shot up and down the court for well over four minutes of the third period, before Brown launched a 3-pointer to advance the Jackets, 47-34, at the 4-minute mark.

The Jackets moved on to a 20-point lead with one minute remaining in the third, but Morgan managed another 3-pointer.

At 7:08, Massey came close to drawing the Devils back to within a 10-point trail, but a series of Jacket scores put the Devils' lead Nicholas out of range. By 8:15, the score was 68-47, Jackets.

French dominated the Devils' scoring in the last minutes of the game, and Travis Sims and David Sparks contributed for Nicholas.

Head Coach Lee Cruse said he expected to face a better team at the end of the season, which, he said, is exactly what he got.

"They are in the same position we are, with starting teams full of freshmen and sophomores, but there is evident improvement in both our playing," Cruse said.

Deming Head Coach Gary McKinney said it's difficult to win and give up 66 points.

"We like to hold it in the 70s, or better yet, in the 60s," McKinney said.

"Nicholas has a good, young ballclub and should have success later on," McKinney said.

Hilander's 43 points not enough

CARLISLE, Feb. 20 — Brian Hilander scored 43 points, but it wasn't enough to help the Bluejackets win as they fell to Mayaville St. Patrick 92-74.

Hilander and Jarrod Willis put the Bluejackets into an early 4-0 lead before the Saints' Mike Carpenter came back to tie the score with 4:47 remaining in the quarter.

The Saints jumped to a 5-point lead as a possible 3-point play turned into five points for the Saints when Drew Travel hit a jump shot and was fouled, rebounded a missed free throw and stepped back to sink a 3-pointer at the top of the key.

At 3:47, Hilander rifled in two shots for an 11-7 trail of the Saints.

As St. Patrick began to pull away with a 15-9 lead, Hilander kept the Jackets in the game with a 3-pointer with 35 seconds left to play in the first.

However, the Saints got the last score of a pair of free throws, which left the Bluejackets trailing the Saints 17-12.

In the second period, Travis Sims brought the Jackets back within three before Travel hit two consecutive 3-point shots.

By 8:45, the Jackets were looking at an 11-point trail, which increased to 16 points two minutes later as the Jackets remained
