Lady Jackets down Deming

CYNTHIANA, Mar. 10 — Nicholas County's Lady Jackets advanced to the finals of the 10th Region Girls Tournament with a 60-44 win over Deming High School. In the second semi-final game of the day at Harrison County High School, Nicholas County took the lead at 2-0 on an eight foot shot in the lane by senior Chris Auxier.

Kristan Gifford canned a three point shot from the right side to give the Lady Devils a 3-2 lead. After Kim Denkins gave Nicholas County a 4-3 lead, Gifford hit again from three point land to make it 6-4.

Denkins knotted the score with a shot in the lane off an inbounds play and gave the Lady Jackets an 8-6 lead with a layup off a nifty assist by Nikki Smoot.

Tacy Earlywine hit a shot in the lane and Denkins closed out scoring in the quarter with another layup.

Deming's only other score came on a three pointer from Cheryl Shephard with 54 seconds to play in the quarter.

At the first stop Nicholas County led 12-9.

Deming tied the score at 16-16 on a shot from the left side by Gifford, but Nicholas County went on a 10-0 run to lead 26-16 with 3:44 to play.

In the run, Hutton had five points, Denkins four, and Earlywine one. Deming also had two blocked shots on one defensive trip down

the floor to bolster the Lady Jackets' attack.

Robyn Messer hit three of four charity tosses to cut the Nicholas lead to 26-19 with 2:28 to play. Denkins went back to a strong inside game to make it 28-19.

Messer canned a layup to keep the Lady Devils within seven, but after a free throw by Smoot, a layup by Kelly Thompson for Deming, and a layup by Earlywine with three seconds to go in the half set the margin at half at 31-23, Nicholas County.

With the exception of the last minute of the third quarter, when Gifford and Shephard hit back-to-back three point shots, the Lady Jackets were able to maintain control of the game.

When Smoot hit an eight foot shot from the right side with 2:33 to play in the quarter, Nicholas County had managed a 14-4 run to lead 45-27.

Gifford added a three point shot and a layup after a steal to cut in minutes with a 49-28 lead.

The scoreboard went blank for the first 4:11 of the last quarter for Deming, while Nicholas County fared little better, only setting two free throws by Earlywine.

Deming was within 11 when Gifford hit a shot in the lane at the 3:49 mark of the last quarter. The closest Deming would get the remainder of the way was 54-44 when Amey Lowdenback hit two free throws with 2:21 to go.

Auxier fielded a pass from Denkins for a layup and Earlywine hit from the inside to push the Nicholas County lead to 58-44.

Clark too strong for Bracken

CYNTHIANA, Mar. 10 — Bracken County stayed close to Clark County in girls semi-final action, but the Lady Cardinals prevailed 58-41.

In the first of two 10th Region girls' semi-final games Saturday afternoon at Harrison County High School, the teams were even at 14-14 at the end of one quarter, but at intermission the Lady Cardinals had pulled ahead 29-24.

In the third quarter, Bracken County held the defending regional champion to only seven points, while scoring 11, including some very strong inside play from senior Cheri McDowell to cut the margin to 36-35 with eight minutes to play.

With 7:42 to play in the game, Bracken County pulled ahead for

the final time on a shot under the basket by junior Janie Goecke to lead 37-36, but a 6-0 run by Clark County kept by a strong full-court press defense gave the Lady Cards a 42-37 lead with 5:35 to go.

Bracken County came back with one, 42-41 on a shot in the lane by Tara Cio and a basket by Molly Linville.

But, the hopes of a berth in the finals ended with 2:34 to go in the game.

Stephanie Davis canned a layup, as did Audrey Hull, Maisha Thomas canned one of two free throws and Hull connected for two and it was 49-41 with 58 seconds to go.

As Bracken County coach Gary Clayton went to his bench to allow his younger players some playing time in the regional, Clark County's coach, Lisa Gordon, left her starting five in for the final minute to set the margin at 58-41.
