Road projects have high priority

State Representative Arnold has been successful in securing several road improvement projects for his district (24th) with the necessary funding appropriated into the Transportation Cabinet's budget.

Arnold, a Mt. Sterling Democrat who represents Nicholas, both and Montgomery counties, said he is pleased with the needed projects.

"Good roads are a major factor to maintaining and enhancing the property and economic growth of any community. And, community

improvement is a major part of the priorities I have established for the residents of my legislative district."

Arnold said he is pleased with the recently released road plan by the Transportation Cabinet Secretary, Mike Bryant.

The plan includes a \$7.9 million project for U.S. Route 68 in Nicholas County. The construction involves major widening for 5.8 miles of the highway from KY State Route 21 NW of Carlisle to KY State Route 1244.

Arnold said he is very grateful to have negotiated the current improvement projects.

"But there is more to be done

and keeping up with necessary road repair as a mandate project requiring careful monitoring.

An improvement of major importance is the proposed bypass and major widening of five miles of U.S. 460 from Mt. Sterling to Camargo.

The cost of construction is estimated at \$11.5 million and is a part of road bond legislation that was recently approved by the 1990 General Assembly.

Also scheduled for construction in 1990 is widening and draining of KY. Route 1269 at the junction of U.S. 60 at Peasie in Bath County.

Arnold said that road projects now in the process of be-

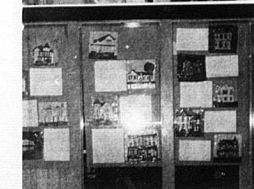


Surprise!

KSP Cadets begin 22 week training
FRANKFORT (AP) - The next Kentucky State Police cadet class began Sunday with 60 people expected to begin the 22-week training.

This will be the first cadet class that was not bound to the 5-foot-six-inch height requirement and whose members were chosen other than by oral examinations.

Applications for the class were returned by 1,574 people. There were 1,200 who reported for initial testing, which included a written exam, physical tests, vision screening and an interview.

The remaining two spots will be filled by cadets injured during the last class. There are nine women and three black men expected to report for the class.
