

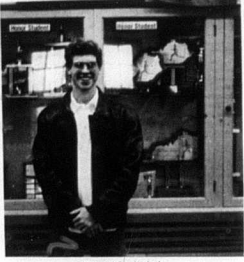

Gabriel goes miles and miles

GABRIEL — Tom Gabriel pounds out the miles, day after day, at a pace most people wouldn't even consider attempting.

His long and fast runs, from 19 to 14 miles on the road. Usually as hard as a 100 miler, he said.
On Monday, the runner does interval work. This running usually involves sprints and are done consecutively to build wind. Gabriel will sometimes do 16 200-meter sprints, sometimes eight half-mile runs. "I only do a mile in the run, but I do a lot of them."

On Tuesdays, Gabriel runs six miles on the road. Wednesdays consist of a 30-minute trail run. Thursdays are a six mile road run and Friday, the day before his races, a three mile run.
"I also run one to two miles to warm up on race days," Gabriel said, "and another one to two to warm down after the race."

GABRIEL — "I'm so excited I'm about to bust," Betty Davenport said Friday. "Everyday has been a surprise," she noted.
Davenport, a Republican, is campaigning for the 30th State Senate seat held by Democratic incumbent Ed Ford of Cynthiana.

Middle Tennessee lost 2-1 to the Raiders adding 23 second half points, while holding the Raiders to 10 in the first half.

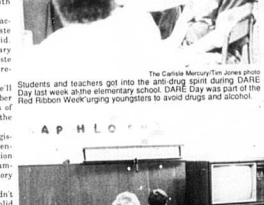
MSU was held to 42 yards on 10 plays through the air, while MTSU had 582 yards rushing and 126 yards passing.
