important step toward solving the problem, Jones added.

Another change of vital importance is establishing a code of ethics in the executive branch of government, he said.

No one in the executive branch of government should do business with the state for personal profit. No one should do business for personal profit with those who have no-bid contracts with the state.

Within 60 seconds of the time that I take the oath of office to become Kentucky's next governor, I will establish by executive order a strong code of ethics for the executive branch of government. I will then ask the legislature to enact such a code of ethics into law.

Honest government will be more efficient government, Jones said.

"How much would we save if every state contract holder knew that they would never be required to make a campaign contribution and could lower their contract prices? And who

would benefit from this? The taxpayers would benefit," Jones said.

Jones also read from a letter he had received from a campaign contributor who asked for a promise of integrity and clean government.

"Let me say to you and to every citizen of this Commonwealth," Jones responded. "In a Jones Administration, you will be able to say with pride: Kentucky is not for sale."
