Surgery patients have common fear

"CABLELE" — I was afraid of being put to sleep and not waking up, Lorna Bussell said Thursday afternoon. "I'd never had any kind of illness and had never been in the hospital before," the 29-year-old Carlisle native stated.

This sort of fear is common among surgery patients, according to Peggy Suthers, R.N., the patient education director at Nicholas County Hospital, oversees a program which educates patients to eliminate the fears of patients entering surgery or taking medication for the first time. The program also provides information on how to take medication and how patients should take care of them.

"CARLISLE" — The Nicholas County Academic Team won the Limestone Academic League tournament held at Maxville Community College last week.

Nicholas County, winner of the Limestone League regular season, defeated four teams to remain undefeated in academic competition this year.

Nicholas County defeated Bracken County in the first round. Anna Koory led all Nicholas County scorers with 30 points in Language Arts.

Anna also scored 24 in Humanities. Other leading scorers for Nicholas County were Todd Wilson, 23 in Math and Brian Canapp, who had 22 points in Social Studies.

Nicholas County placed Lewis County in the second round match-up. It marked their second win over the powerful Lewis County team this year.

Anna Koory led all scorers in a record setting performance. Anna scored 36 points in the Language Arts portion of the contest. She correctly answered 17 of the 20 questions in the test-up phase of the game, setting the Limestone record.

Anna also had 23 points in the Humanities and 20 points in Social Studies.

Other leading scorers in the Lewis County contest were Todd Wilson, 25 in Math, Jill Hardin, 24 in Math and Brian Canapp, 27 in Social Studies. The Blue Jacket academic team met Maxville St. Patrick's in the semi-finals of the tournament behind Anna Koory's 29 Language Arts points and 25 Humanities points. Nicholas County defeated St. Pat's 131-111.

Other leading scorers for the Blue Jackets were Todd Wilson, 21 points in Math, Jill Hardin, 26 in Math and Mary Rawlings. Nicholas County team has ever beaten an academic squad from Lewis County.
