Conservation measures
Lower fuel costs
With the price of crude oil soaring above \$20 a barrel, consumers are concerned with more than just the cost of the gasoline they put in their tanks. They're concerned about how they can save a few bucks on energy costs in the home when the bills come due.
There are things that homeowners can do to reduce their energy costs, said Bill Murphy, Extension horticulturist and energy specialist with the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture.
"Generally, the same conservation practices that apply to other energy sources apply to homes heated with oil furnaces," he said. "Windows are a good place to start. For example, the most potential for saving in the home is in the furnace at all it's in the furnace. Murphy said even at best, more heat is lost through windows than any other part of the home, but many homes lose more heat than they need to as a result of leaks.
A single-pane window will have an R value of one, he said. A double-pane storm window will have a value of two, and even if the resident adds a plastic cover on the inside, a practice Murphy recommends to conserve energy, the R value will be there. This compares with a typical R value of 15 for most walls.
"Weatherstripping, caulking window edges, closing up those leaks can reduce energy costs whether the home is heated by oil, natural gas or electricity," he said.
Those homes that do heat with oil furnaces might consider checking the spray nozzle on their furnaces. Some older furnaces have larger nozzles than necessary.
Simply replacing the nozzle with a smaller one, something a handy homeowner might be able to do, could lower costs and increase efficiency, Murphy said.
"One thing a lot of people overlook is the furnace as the hood over their kitchen oven," he said. "Many people never use it at all, but they don't realize that they are just heating the house that heat up."
