

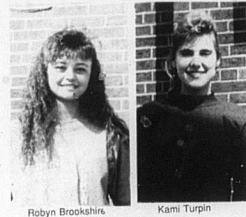

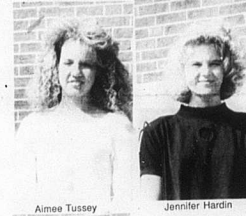
Kami Turpin

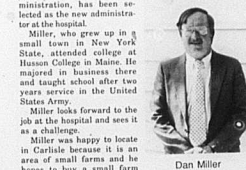


Aimee Tussey

CARLISLE — The week of October 7-13 has been declared Earthquake Preparedness Week in Kentucky by Governor Wallace Wilkinson.

Kentucky, which is located close to the New Madrid Fault, stands to suffer significant damage should a large quake occur.

According to state government press releases, scientific experts are virtually certain a large quake in the 6.0 to 8.5 range on the Richter scale will take place in the New Madrid fault area in the next 50 years.
