Morehead 2-3 travels to Tech

COOKEVILLE, Tennessee — Morehead State University will take its 2-3 record on the road to battle Tennessee Tech University, Saturday afternoon at 2:30 p.m.

Tennessee Tech is coming off a shocking 16-1 win over Murray State last Saturday, while Morehead defeated Morgan State 47-0 in the Eagles annual Parents' game in Morehead, Sunday.

Tennessee Tech leads the series, 25-16-1. The schools first met in 1936 and the Eagles won that first game, 148, but later forfeited the game for use on an ineligible player.

MSU record setting quarterback, Chris Swartz is a Bath County native, has had outstanding success against Tech in the past. As a freshman in 1987, he hit 35 of 66 passes for 336 yards and two touchdowns. He set three national records in a game, and two all-time. He has 35 completions and 56 attempts are still records in the Division I-AA, and his 66 attempts without an interception was a record at the time.

His three game career against Tennessee Tech includes 72 of 128 passes for 752 yards with no interceptions and three touchdowns. While Swartz has had success, MSU Head Coach Cole Proctor plans some playing time for true freshman Jeremy Holbrook. "We will try and get him as much playing time as we can in every game the rest of the season."

Holbrook scored two touchdowns in his first collegiate game against Morgan State. Holbrook, the first player Proctor recruited for MSU, is a strong option running quarterback. Proctor has said the option is his preferred running game. Holbrook scored a touchdown on his second play as a college quarterback. "We will have to find a way to be consistent on offense," Proctor lamented. Monmouth and the Bluejackets have the Eagles from grandchildren, several nieces, nephews and cousins.
