ORDINANCE NO. 10, 1990 AN ORDINANCE VEHICLES BY AD VALOREM TAX ON ALL MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE CITY OF CARLISLE, KENTUCKY.

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable to adopt an ad valorem tax on motor vehicles in the City of Carlisle, Kentucky;

IT IS ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CARLISLE, KENTUCKY:

Section 1: That the ad valorem property tax rate for the year 1991 on motor vehicles is hereby fixed at 18 cents on each and every \$100.00 worth of motor vehicles, as of January 1, 1990 subject to general fund purposes.

Section 2: All taxes levied herein shall be for the general expenses of the City of Carlisle, Kentucky and the above taxes shall not be used for any other purpose than that for which they are levied.

Section 3: The City Clerk shall certify that 1991 motor vehicle property tax rate to the Department of Property Taxation, Frankfort, Kentucky.

This Ordinance shall take effect as of January 1, 1991 after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 8, 1990 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCES RELATING TO THE STORAGE, HANDLING, COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF TRASH WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CARLISLE, KENTUCKY, PROVIDING FOR SERVICE CHARGES, FIXING PENALTIES.

Section 1: That collection and disposal program has increased customers and it is deemed necessary to secure additional charges.

Section 2: That monthly trash collection service charges for offices, business establishments and industrial plants be as follows:

Section 3: That the City Council of Carlisle, Kentucky, shall be authorized to set trash collection service charges, based on current charges for that classification, for each new industrial plant, business establishment, office or residence that may come into being within the corporate limits of the City of Carlisle, Kentucky after passage of this ordinance.

Section 4: That, except leaves, shall be placed in fly-proof and water-proof containers with tight-fitting covers and of a size which can be conveniently handled. Leaves may be placed in a paper-type box.

Section 5: Containers shall be placed at the curb or most accessible collection place on the collection date, and shall be removed therefrom on the same date on which they are emptied.

Section 6: No trash shall be burned within the city limits, other than in an approved type incinerator, and no garbage shall be mixed with trash.

Section 7: Whoever violates any provision of this ordinance shall be fined not more than \$500.00 for each offense.

Section 8: This ordinance shall become effective upon its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
