

All-Aboard: Trains make ready

Smoke bellows from the old 1925 Steam Engines as it rumbles the track traveling through Kentucky's beautiful country side.

As the train moves along, passengers may view newly torn fields as they roam pastures of some of the state's most beautiful thoroughbred farms.

The date is May 18, 1991. The mood is "sentimental." There is a nostalgia feeling in the air, as passengers board 1920 vintage rail cars in Paris, Kentucky.

The destination is the beautiful city of Mayville, which sits on the banks of the Ohio River.

This will be the third or fourth time some of these passengers have taken this opportunity to "go back in time" and quest their thirst for more knowledge about what their ancestors experienced and saw in "days gone by."

The scenery along the way is almost the same. The countryside, itself, differs little from what was viewed in the 1800s when the Central Kentucky Railway became characterized as "The Blue-Gray Route."

The adventure will begin on Saturday morning, at 9 a.m. when the train leaves the Kentucky Central Railway Junction. Guests will be served complimentary coffee and sweet rolls immediately.

They will view the rolling hills, Stoner Creek and the Linking River.

They will experience the thrill of going through the Cowan and Pleasant Valley Tunnels, and watch the thoroughbred race away as the "Iron Horse" approaches.

Upon arrival in Mayville, guests will transport riders to the Kamada Inn, where they will be assigned rooms and served lunch before boarding shuttles for a visit to historic Washington.

Four guides will lead guests through this quaint village that is full of historic buildings and structures. Washington is world-famous for its Frontier Christmas celebrations.

Fans of Mark Twain will be interested in the Paxton Inn, which was built in 1810. The Huckleberry Finn television program was filmed in the upstairs room when it featured the Court Room scenes.

The Inn was also associated with the railroad.

After the tours, there will be ample time to visit the antique and gift shops.

For those who wish to take a break from the past and re-enter the present, transportation will be available to visit a Mason County state-of-the-art dairy farm.

Other trips offered this summer will be 35-mile round trips between Paris and Carlisle. Departures from Paris will be 2 p.m. on June 8 and 9, July 13 and 14, and August 10 and 11. Due to popularity of groups, it is recommended that reservations for these trips be made as early as possible.

Mayville, like Washington, has an abundance of historic information for those who have a craving for more knowledge of a yesteryear.

Buildings such as "Phillips Folly," certainly make one year to "hear the rest of the story."

Several private homes, not previously open for viewing, will be available to Kentucky Central passengers.

After returning to the train, guests will be provided refreshments upon departure for the return trip to Paris.

Reservations for this 100-mile overnight excursion must be received in the mail by May 1.
