It happened here Tuesday, April 9, when state officials threw a party for the Kentucky Education Reform Act (KERA), which was signed into law a year ago this month.

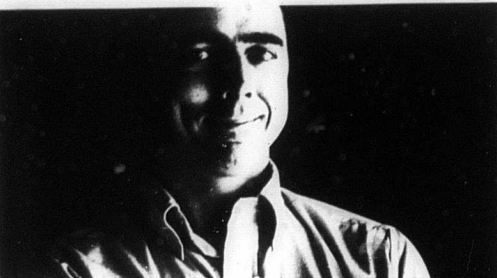
The governor, legislative leaders and state education officials gathered in a festively decorated gym at Second Street Elementary School in Frankfort to pay tribute to the landmark reform act that promises to put Kentucky at the head of the national education class.

The carefully orchestrated symbolism could not be overlooked as students at the school filed by to get their piece of the 11x14-foot cake prepared especially for the occasion by bakers at a local Kruger store.

Leading the ceremony, Dr. Thomas Boyesen, commissioner of education, compared the state's education reform effort to the classic children's tale, "The Little Engine That Could."
