Morehead State University's varsity cheerleaders have won the national title in Division I at the College Cheerleading Championships in San Antonio, Texas, held April 5-6.

Also, two members of the squad - Michael Pave, Southbury, Conn., sophomore, and Suzette Hignite, Flatwoods senior - won the national partner stunt title.

In the Universal Cheerleaders Association sponsored competition, MSU faces opposition from five other finalist groups: James Madison University, George Mason University, University of North Carolina-Wilmington, Wright State University, and the University of Alabama-Birmingham.

Services were Monday at the First Church of God, Bethlehem road, Paris, with Rev. Tim Pierce and Tony Coomer.

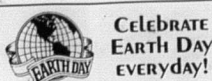

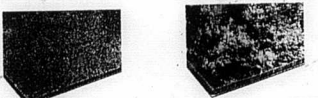
