Selective Service Easier, Briefly

Registration with Selective Service is, for a brief period, to be easier than ever.

Young men about to turn 18 may register while attending the Kentucky State Fair in Louisville, August 15-18. Selective Service officials will be on hand to explain the registration process and answer any questions.

Young men are required to register at the post office within 30 days of their 18th birthday by filling out a simple card. Registration is linked to federal student aid, job training benefits, and most federal employment.

By adding their names to the Selective Service list, a young man not only complies with the law, but also guarantees his eligibility for many important federal benefits.

Kentucky's high compliance rate reflects the willingness of their young men to accept the responsibilities as well as the benefits of citizenship, and to serve this country at a time of need. Of the 14 million young men who are registered, over 220,000 are from Kentucky.

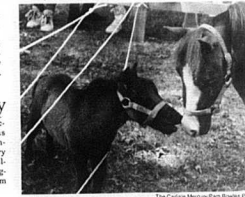

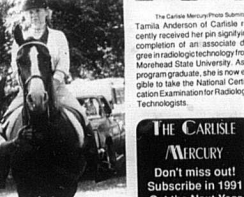
