Hamilton receives Governor's Scholar Award

Morehead State University has announced that Julie Ann Hamilton of Carlisle is among those students receiving the Governor's Scholar Award and a Presidential Scholarship for the fall semester.

Participants in the Kentucky Governor's Scholarship Program are automatically eligible for the Governor's Scholar Award. The Scholarship is awarded to the top 100 students in each class who are American and a National Merit Semi-Finalist.

Simon's receives MSU alumni awards

Morehead State University has announced that Amy Lynn Simon of Carlisle is among those students receiving the Morehead State University and Alumni Awards for the fall semester.

Students who are admitted as an entering freshman at MSU as an entering transfer student, have an Admissions Index of at least 500; transfer students must have a 3.00 grade point average (on a 4.00 scale) for the equivalent of at least one full term, and submit a completed scholarship application to MSU.

Simon, daughter of Jim and Lynn Simon, is a graduate of Nicholas County High School. She is a member of the Student Council and placed first in medicine and health at the Northeast Regional Science Fair earlier this year.

The scholarship, valued at \$500 per year, is renewable for three academic years if a 2.75 g.p.a. is maintained during each of the first two semesters and a minimum cumulative 3.00 g.p.a. for each semester thereafter.

To be eligible for the Morehead State University Award, applicants must be admitted to MSU as an entering freshman or transfer student; have an Admissions Index of at least 500; transfer students must have at least a 3.00 grade point average (on a 4.00 scale) for the equivalent of at least one full term, and submit a completed scholarship application to MSU.

The scholarship, valued at \$1000 per year, is renewable for three academic years if a 3.25 g.p.a. is maintained during each of the first two semesters and a minimum cumulative 3.50 g.p.a. for each semester thereafter.
